

Failed Safety Inspection Process



When your vehicle fails inspection for Registration, please refer to the following procedure:

- 1. Take the failed Safety Inspection certificate to Satellite City Hall to correct the Registration issue.
- 2. Once the registration has been corrected, the vehicle must be re-inspected. The reinspection is free and done as a walk-in (no appointment needed) within 30 days of the original inspection. After 30 days you will need to make an appointment and will be charged for a new inspection
- 3. Prior to re-inspection, all registration-related items must be on the vehicle:
 - a. If you're getting new license plates, they must be mounted front and rear before coming for re-inspection
 - b. If you're keeping out-of-state plates, the blue sticker issued by Satellite City Hall must be affixed to the rear bumper, visible from 50 feet away, before coming for re-inspection.
 - c. Brackets to mount the stickers are available for purchase at Five-O Motors and in the community. If you do not want a sticker on your bumper, please affix a bracket to the vehicle before coming in for re-inspection.
 - d. The stickers are controlled items and must be placed on the vehicle by the inspector
- Re-inspections do not need an appointment. They are done 10am- 12pm and 1pm-5pm. We are closed Mon- Tues.
- 5. When you return for your re-inspection please park in the customer parking area and check in with the receptionist. The re-inspection will be done in between regular appointments so there may be a short wait.
- 6. The inspector will need to photograph your vehicle, registration and proof of Hawaii insurance. Please bring these documents with you.
